The only military equipment NATO has is a fleet of early warning radar planes and five surveillance drones. Strange, isn't it?

This exclusivist club is showing an "open-doors" policy, so everyone who meets the requirements and obligations that its members have already established is free to join. The United States is without

doubt the biggest and most influential member. But, in my opinion, this reality can also represent their vulnerability, because the alliance is the one international forum where Washington agrees to put its military might up for negotiation and can be persuaded to act differently by its allies. For me, this is the essence of NATO: not being afraid to show your weakness, in order to become stronger, with the help of your allies, while serving a greater purpose than your own.

This kind of trusting each other is crucial in terms of terrorism, the most frightening global threat there is. NATO is currently joining the international coalition fighting the Islamic State group and setting up a counter-terrorism intelligence cell to improve information-sharing. Unfortunately, this organization has been subject to many geopolitical discussions, which can alter its common purpose. Many leaders have different opinions on handling things, especially when it comes to preserving peace which involves money spending, so it is very likely for NATO to get weakened from within because of the lack of sufficient funding from all its members. But I consider it should only be about understanding the power of partnership, and the reciprocal nature of its bonds, in an alliance that stands for something far bigger than paying your dues on time.

This is the reason that many wonder whether the alliance still has a purpose, since the trans-Atlantic alliance was created to "*keep the Soviet Union out, the Americans in and the Germans down*", in the words of NATO's first secretary general, Lord Ismay. While NATO continues to adapt to changes in the security environment, the fundamentals of how it works haven't changed. Consensus and consultation are part of NATO's construction. All member countries are represented in the North Atlantic Council, where decisions are made by consensus, expressing the collective will of all the member nations. There is no NATO army. National forces are under national command. When called upon, allied nations volunteer their troops, equipment or other capabilities to NATO operations and exercises. Each member state pays for its own armed forces, and covers the costs of deploying its forces. But together, the allies get a lot more security for a lot less cost than they would if they had to do it alone. Each member contributes a small percentage of its national defence budget to NATO. The national contributions pay for running the political and operational headquarters in Belgium, as well as the integrated military command structure across NATO territory.
